INTRODUCTION

The G-4 Operations Chief, Operations Branch, Logistics Division (G-4) position is on the staff of the Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S) G-4 of the Commander, U.S. Marine Corps Forces, Special Operations Command (MARSOC) at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. MARSOC is one of four components of U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM). The AC/S G-4 is a U.S. Marine Corps Colonel (O-6) supervising a 63-person Division providing logistics functional area support to the force, including: Logistics Operations; Contracting; Facilities and Military Construction Management; Material Readiness; and Strategic Mobility; and reporting to the Commander, MARSOC (COMMARFORSOC). COMMARFORSOC is a U.S. Marine Corps Major General (O-8) and reports to the Commander, U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM). In this capacity, COMMARFORSOC exercises command over a force of over 4, 000 Active Duty, Reserve and Civilian personnel from both the U.S. Marine Corps (USMC) and the U.S. Navy.

As the G-4 Operations Chief for the G-4 Operations, the incumbent holds a position of great responsibility and influence over the activities of three Major Subordinate Commands (MSCs) organic to MARSOC operating from Marine Bases Camp Lejeune and Camp Pendleton: The Marine Special Operations Regiment (MSOR), the Marine Special Operations Support Group (MSOSG), and the Marine Special Operations School (MSOS).

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Position requires a TOP SECRET security clearance. Incumbent requires favorable adjudication of a Single Scope Background Investigation (SSBI) or equivalent must be eligible and maintain eligibility for access to Sensitive Compartmented Information (SCI), based on DCID 6/4 (or ICD 704 once it is signed).
2. This position is a drug testing designated position under the DoN Drug-Free Workplace Program.
3. The incumbent may be required to work other than normal duty hours, which may include evenings, weekends, and/or holidays. Periodic travel is required.
4. The incumbent must possess and maintain a valid state driver's license.
5. The incumbent must be able to obtain and maintain a Government no-fee passport for international travel.
